THINGS TO KNOW

- Pre-enter your exhibits by **Wednesday**, July 12th to expedite the entry process.
- Items not pre-entered will still be accepted.
- There is no cost to enter your exhibit(s).
- Nonperishable entries can be brought to the North Iowa Events Center (Olson Building) on Monday, July 17th from 4:00 PM – 8:00 PM or Tuesday, July 18th from 8:00 AM – 10:00AM.
- Perishable entries (food, flowers, etc.) can be brought in on Tuesday, July 18th from 6:00 PM – 8:00 PM or Wednesday, July 19th from 8:00 AM – 10:00 AM.
- The decision of the judge(s) is final. Ribbons and premiums are only awarded if warranted.
- Entries must have been prepared by the exhibitor.
- All exhibits must remain on display for the duration of the Fair.
- Junior exhibitors must note their age on the entry form or they will be judged as an adult.
- Junior exhibitors are considered 17 or under as of the date the form is submitted.
- Entries may be removed on Sunday, July 23rd from 7:00 PM – 9:00 PM or Monday, July 24th from 4:00 PM – 7:00 PM. If neither of those days work, please call the Fair Office to make arrangements.
- Premium payouts will be issued within 10 business days of the last day of the Fair and must be cashed by September 30th or will be considered a donation to the Fair.
- The North Iowa Fair Association is not responsible for the loss or damage of any entry or exhibit.

Quilt Division Rules

- Tags will be issued to each exhibitor. Exhibits not properly tagged before entering are subject to disqualification.
- One entry per lot. Maximum of four ribbons per lot, if applicable.
- Entries must be made by exhibitor and not exhibited previously.
- Judging criteria includes general appearance, cleanliness, neatness, workmanship and finishing.
- Soiled, fur covered, or stained articles will be disqualified.
- Write the name of quilt pattern on tag of all quilted exhibits.
- Personal signatures must be covered.
- Size categories include quilts over 240 inches in perimeter (twin, full, queen, king) or under 240 inches in perimeter (wall quilts, lap quilts, table runners, bed runners). A separate category is listed for miniature and doll quilts.
- Additional lots may be formed if enough competition warrants its creation.

Class 500 – Traditional Quilts, Pieced

- 1. Quilts over 240 inches, pieced, hand quilted
- 2. Quilts over 240 inches, pieced, commercially machine quilted
- 3. Quilts over 240 inches, pieced, machine quilted by exhibitor
- 4. Quilts under 240 inches, pieced, hand quilted
- 5. Quilts under 240 inches, pieced, commercially machine quilted
- 6. Quilts under 240 inches, pieced, machine quilted by exhibitor

Class 501 – Hand Appliqued Quilts

Lot #:

- 1. Quilts over 240 inches, hand applique, hand quilted
- 2. Quilts over 240 inches, hand applique, machine quilted by exhibitor
- 3. Quilts under 240 inches, hand applique, hand quilted
- 4. Quilts under 240 inches, hand applique, machine quilted by exhibitor

Class 502 – Machine Appliqued Quilts

Lot #:

- 1. Quilts over 240 inches, machine applique, hand quilted
- 2. Quilts over 240 inches, machine applique, commercially machine quilted
- 3. Quilts over 240 inches, machine applique, machine quilted by exhibitor
- 4. Quilts under 240 inches, machine applique, hand quilted
- 5. Quilts under 240 inches, machine applique, commercially machine quilted
- 6. Quilts under 240 inches, machine applique, machine quilted by exhibitor

Class 503 – Embroidered Quilts

- 1. Quilts over 240 inches, machine embroidered, hand quilted
- 2. Quilts over 240 inches, machine embroidered, commercially machine quilted
- 3. Quilts over 240 inches, machine embroidered, machine quilted by exhibitor
- 4. Quilts under 240 inches, machine embroidered, hand quilted
- 5. Quilts under 240 inches, machine embroidered, commercially machine quilted
- 6. Quilts under 240 inches, machine embroidered, machine quilted by exhibitor

Class 504 – Mixed Technique Quilts

Combinations of two or more techniques where the additional techniques are more than embellishment. Sampler quilts would be placed in this class.

Lot #:

- 1. Quilts over 240 inches, mixed technique, hand quilted
- 2. Quilts over 240 inches, mixed technique, commercially quilted
- 3. Quilts over 240 inches, mixed technique, machine quilted by exhibitor
- 4. Quilts under 240 inches, mixed technique, hand quilted
- 5. Quilts under 240 inches, mixed technique, commercially machine quilted
- 6. Quilts under 240 inches, mixed technique, machine quilted by exhibitor

Class 505 – Innovative Quilts & Miscellaneous

Innovative quilts that extend beyond traditional disciplines and exercise progressiveness. Independence and originality in theory, design, color or technique.

Lot #:

- 1. Mixed technique, any size, any quilting technique
- 2. Original design
- 3. Quilts that do not fit any other category

Class 506 – Miniature or Doll Quilts

One side of the quilt is 18" or less. A miniature typically is a very small version of a bed size quilt pattern and meant to be hung for display.

- 1. Pieced, hand quilted
- 2. Pieced, machine quilted commercially
- 3. Pieced, machine quilted by exhibitor
- 4. Applique, hand quilted
- 5. Applique, machine quilted commercially
- 6. Applique, machine quilted by exhibitor
- 7. Hand embroidered by exhibitor
- 8. Machine embroidered by exhibitor

Class 507 – Quilt Made By a Group

Includes quilts made up of blocks or components created by individual members of an organized group of quilters.

Lot #:

- 1. Block exchange quilt
- 2. Round robin quilt (each member adds to the preceding block)
- 3. Other group (not listed above)

Class 508 – Found & Finished

This class is for quilt tops found by exhibitor and either hand or machine quilted by the exhibitor. May include smaller quilted items from loose single blocks, but must have quilted finish work done by the exhibitor. Judging will be based on quilted pattern, technique and design use of loose blocks.

1. Any sized quilt

Class 509 – Beginning Quilters

This class is for first time quilters.

1. Any sized quilt

Class 510 – Quilted Household Items

Includes smaller quilted fabric items, not bedding.

Class 511 – Quilted Wearing Apparel

Lot #:

1. Quilted wearing apparel

Handwork Division Judging Criteria

- Appearance cleanliness, colors, designs, blocking/pressing, choice of fibers, threads and patterns.
- Workmanship neatness, tension, pattern execution, gauge, absence of knots, piecing, no lines.
- Finishing framing, binding, fringe, blocking, pillow form, seam finishing

- 1. Afghan or blanket (any size)
- 2. Clothing
- 3. Household
- 4. Other

Class 513 – Knit

Lot #:

- 1. Afghan or blanket (any size)
- 2. Clothing
- 3. Household
- 4. Other

Class 514 – Hand Embroidery

Lot #:

- 1. Household item (table runner, napkins, dishtowels)
- 2. Clothing
- 3. Other

Class 515 – Machine Embroidery

Lot #:

- 1. Household item (table runner, napkins, dishtowels)
- 2. Clothing
- 3. Other

Class 516 – Counted Cross Stitch

Lot #:

- 1. Wall hanging or picture (worked from pattern or chart)
- 2. Original design
- 3. Other

Class 517 – Other Handwork

Lot #:

- 1. Counted thread technique
- 2. Needlepoint
- 3. Punch needle handwork
- 4. Holiday decorations of fabric (For holiday decorations not listed in any other class)
- 5. Clothing made with new material
- 6. Recycled clothing or accessory (made with used/recycled materials)
- 7. Hand or loom weaving (including rugs)
